JANUARY COUNCIL MINUTES

Presentation was made by the Constitution and By Laws Committee. John Bullington gave an update on the Constitution and By-Laws Committee. They met once a month since March 2016 and the members of the committee were Wendy Fitch, Jack Davis, Andy West and John Bullington. John said that there was not an electronic file of St. John's Constitution but now we have one. John contacted Melanie Bookout at the Synod office to help with our constitution. Chapters 10 – 14 can be changed because this is St. John's but the ELCA is the only ones that can make any changes. The Constitution and By-Laws Committee requested feedback form St. John's committee on how they operate. The committee invited a focus group to meet in November to review the presentation and see if they had any changes. John said the next step is to get the Church Council to approve and then it would be submitted to the Synod office for approval. Once the Synod approves it they will send it back to St. John's and we will have a congregational meeting to vote on the new Constitution.

Andy West went over the changes. He said there is an introduction and table of contents. Andy said referred to the constitution as a sandwich: Chapters 1 thru 9 are the top of the bread and cannot be changed; Chapters 10 thru 14 are the meat of the sandwich and references St. John's and Chapters 15-19 are the bottom of the bread. He said 95% of the constitution is dictated by the Synod and cannot be changed.

Andy said the Cemetery Committee has three people as trustees. At large members will be assigned to a specific committee. There will be a transition period for committees: Family Ministry will transition to Cemetery and Bricks and Mortar will transition to Endowment. Wendy Fitch said that Laura Fitch has resigned from the Church council as the member of Family Ministry.

Pastor John gave out a personality inventory form for the council members to fill out. The results were interesting we had 3 Lions, 5 Otters, 3 Golden Retrievers and 2 Beavers.

Nancy Porter gave out a copy of the guidelines and form that will be used to request funds from Endowment and Cemetery Committee. There will be three copies: Finance Board, Endowment Committee and the original will be filed with the church council minutes. In November we requested 10% from Endowment for Operating which was \$4399 and 5 % for Capital which was \$2199 from unrestricted funds and the check was received from Endowment in December. The money will be requested each year in November so the check can be received in December.

Pastor's Report – Pastor John said Worship and Music Board will be meeting on Sunday. Pastor John said that St. John's was such a blessing and the congregation was welcoming and warm.

Report of the Treasurer: Max went over the condensed balance sheet. Nancy made the motion to move the 5% which is \$2,199.00 from the Capital Budget which is now in Contingency to the Building Renovation Fund and to move \$9,157.59 to the Operating Account from the Contingency Fund to Operating Account to offset budget deficit for 2016 and was seconded by Alice Dellinger. Motion carried. Motion was made by Nancy Porter to accept the Treasurer Report and seconded by Dr. Nelson Jenkins. Motion carried.

Finance: Nancy Porter said the request form was filled out to submit to Endowment Committee for \$5,304.00 from the Cemetery Fund will be sent to Endowment for the maintenance in January. Motion was made by Nancy Porter to submit cemetery request form to Endowment for Cemetery Maintenance seconded by Alice Dellinger. Motion carried.

Property: John Dellinger said that we have had two issues with key and we need to adopt a key control policy. Barbara gave an update of what the latest issue was. Friday a week ago Barbara went to lunch early and got back around 12:15 and she and Kim Eaker came in the church. There was a car parked in the parking lot and when Barbara and Kim got to the church door the car cranked up and left. Patsy Dellinger stopped by about 20 minutes later and she was in the office talking to Barbara and Kim and they heard a cell phone ring but it wasn't their phones. Barbara called the police and when they came she went to let them in on the Dixie Street side and Kim heard a door close on Elm Street side. The police searched the entire building but didn't find anyone. The Cherryville Police Department suggested that the exterior door locks be changed. Barbara called Matt Mauney Friday afternoon and told him what had happened and he contacted John Dellinger. The Property Board and Security Team made the decision to change all the locks immediately and Matt would announce it a worship on Sunday. The locks were changed on Wednesday
